



High Risk Infant Follow Up (HRIF) Clinic

Our HRIF Clinic is dedicated to your child's development through recurring developmental assessment within the first three years of life. We provide comprehensive medical care, care coordination, resources, and psychosocial support while advocating for early intervention services. Our specialized team of physicians, physical therapists, occupational therapists, speech and language pathologists, and social workers are here to support babies and their families who are born prematurely or with complex medical needs.

Clinic Goals:

- Screen babies considered high risk for developmental delays or neurodevelopmental diagnoses
- Provide continued monitoring and early intervention recommendations
- Identify medical referrals to specialists
- Provide additional care to primary care pediatricians and ongoing therapy

Services offered at our HRIF Clinic:

- Developmental screening of cognition, language, and motor skills using the Bayley Scales of Infant and Toddler Development, 4th edition
- Neurodevelopmental assessment for infants under 12 months old using the Hammersmith Infant Neurological Examination (HINE)
- Feeding screening to ensure your baby is getting proper nutrition
- Physician involvement for comprehensive evaluations
- Personalized care plans and recommendations tailored to your baby's unique needs

Who to Refer?

- Birth weight 1500 grams or less
- PMA 36 weeks or less
- IVH, PVL or cysts
- Hydrocephalus
- CLD
- IUGR
- HIE, Neurological Depression
- Dysphagia, Feeding Difficulties
- Genetic Anomalies
- Drug exposure/withdrawal

When to Refer?

- As soon as a few weeks after discharge home
- Developmental Concerns
- May be followed up to 2 years corrected age


Our goal is to provide whole-patient care. That's why DMG CRS also includes:
